SIXTH AMENDMENT TO CITY OF SAN JOSE GRANT AGREEMENT

This SIXTH AMENDMENT TO CITY OF SAN JOSE GRANT AGREEMENT ("SIXTH AMENDMENT"), is made and entered into upon the date of execution by CITY, by and between the **CITY OF SAN JOSE**, a municipal corporation of the State of California ("CITY"), and HEALING GROVE HEALTH CENTER FOUNDATION, INC., a California nonprofit corporation ("GRANTEE"). For the purposes of this SIXTH AMENDMENT, CITY and GRANTEE are sometimes collectively referred to as "Parties."

RECITALS

WHEREAS, on December 3, 2020, CITY and GRANTEE entered into a certain agreement titled "City of San José Grant Agreement" for a grant of \$686,749 in CARES Act Coronavirus Relief Funds ("CRF") to support GRANTEE's food distribution to Target Populations impacted by COVID-19 for a term retroactive from October 15, 2020 through December 30, 2020 ("AGREEMENT"); and

WHEREAS, on March 8, 2021, CITY and GRANTEE entered into a FIRST AMENDMENT to the Grant Agreement to extend the term through March 31, 2021 and increase the maximum amount of total compensation by granting \$392,428 to GRANTEE, and allowing GRANTEE to spend down the remaining funds in the amount of \$31,880.55; and

WHEREAS, on May 13, 2021 CITY and GRANTEE entered into a SECOND AMENDMENT to the Grant Agreement to extend the term through April 30, 2021, revise the Scope of Services, the Budget Summary, and the Payments to Grantee and Reporting Schedule in order to increase the maximum total compensation to \$1,196,441; and

WHEREAS, on June 2, 2021, CITY and GRANTEE entered into a THIRD AMENDMENT to the Grant Agreement to extend the term through May 31, 2021, revise the Scope of Services, the Budget Summary, and the Payments to Grantee and Reporting Schedule in order to increase the maximum total compensation to \$1,263,319; and

WHEREAS, on June 16, 2021, CITY and GRANTEE entered into a FOURTH AMENDMENT to the Grant Agreement to extend the term through June 30, 2021, revise the Scope of Services, the Budget Summary, and the Payments to Grantee and Reporting Schedule in order to increase the maximum total compensation to \$1,330,197; and

WHEREAS, on July 18, 2021, CITY and GRANTEE entered into a FIFTH AMENDMENT to the Grant Agreement to extend the term through July 31, 2021, revise the Scope of Services, the Budget Summary, and the Payments to Grantee and Reporting Schedule in order to increase the maximum total compensation to \$1,397,075; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 23 of the AGREEMENT, CITY and GRANTEE desire to amend the AGREEMENT to revise the Budget Summary;

NOW, THEREFORE, the Parties agree to continue and amend the Agreement as follows:

SECTION 1. Revised Exhibit C, "Budget Summary," is hereby replaced in its entirety with Sixth Revised Exhibit C attached hereto.

<u>SECTION 2.</u> Reaffirmation: In the event of an inconsistency between this SIXTH AMENDMENT and the AGREEMENT, the terms and conditions of this SIXTH AMENDMENT shall govern and control the rights and obligations of the Parties. All other terms and conditions of the AGREEMENT not changed, amended, or modified by this SIXTH AMENDMENT shall remain in full force and effect.

<u>SECTION 3.</u> Counterparts. This SIXTH AMENDMENT may be executed in any number of counterparts and by each party in separate counterparts, each of which when so executed and delivered shall be deemed to be an original and all of which taken together shall constitute one and the same instrument.

SECTION 4. Use of electronic signatures: Unless otherwise prohibited by law or CITY policy, the parties agree that an electronic copy of a signed contract, or an electronically signed contract, has the same force and legal effect as a contract executed with an original ink signature. The term "electronic copy of a signed contract" refers to a writing as set forth in Evidence Code Section 1550. The term "electronically signed contract" means a contract that is executed by applying an electronic signature using technology approved by the CITY.

SUBJECT: APPROVAL OF RETROACTIVITY IN THE SIXTH AMENDMENT FOR HEALING GROVE HEALTH CENTER

In June 2013, the City Auditor released an audit report entitled "Consulting Agreements: Better Enforcement of Procurement Rules, Monitoring, and Transparency is Needed." (City Audit Report No. 13-06.) Recommendation No. 4 (Audit Report pages 16-17) involves limiting retroactive agreements to situations where contract execution is in process. The audit report states that when a City employee informally authorizes work before execution of the agreement, the employee commits City funds not within his/her authority to commit.

The Emergency Operation Center (EOC), Food and Necessities Branch, is seeking authorization for the retroactive provision in the following agreements under the Collective Impact and Unmet Needs Grant:

• Sixth Amendment to Healing Grove Health Center

On December 15, 2020 City Council approved the continuation of agreements with organizations qualified under the Collective Impact and Unmet Needs Grant Program for an aggregate compensation of \$2,000,000 from the General Fund from the Food and Necessities Branch. The agreements awarded under this funding began on or about December 31, 2020 with the initial term ending March 31, 2021.

On July 18, 2021, City entered into a Fifth Amendment with Healing Grove Health Center under the Collective Impact and Unmet Needs Grant to continue providing meal distribution and employment services to San Jose residents impacted by COVID-19.

On August 9, 2021, Healing Grove Health Center submitted the final financial report with budget line items that did not align to those in the executed Fifth Amendment. As one line item had a

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difference greater than 10%, it was determined a Sixth Amendment was necessary to reflect the accurate budget.

The Department understands that retroactive clauses are to be avoided. However, in this instance, the final spending by Grantee was not reported until the end of the program term, resulting in the need for a retroactive amendment.

The Department requests an exception be made and the amendments detailed in this memorandum be allowed to proceed with retroactive clauses.
