Attachment A: Tasks

The Consultant shall provide the services and deliverables set forth in this **Attachment A**. The Consultant shall provide all services and deliverables required by this **Attachment A** to the satisfaction of the City's contract manager.

General Description of Project for which Consultant will Provide Services: The Site is comprised of two parcels identified as Santa Clara County Assessor's Parcel Numbers (APNs) 259-28-001 and 259-28-002, located at the northeast corner of the intersection of Stockton Avenue and The Alameda in a mixed residential, commercial, industrial land use area. The Site currently appears to be occupied by various automobile service businesses (e.g., automobile repairs and washing) and a clothing alterations business, including San Jose Steam Cleaning, Excellent Alterations, Stockton Car Wash, and DLT Collision & Services. The Site is currently developed with an operating steam clean area, car wash area, wash rack sludge drying area, and a clothing alterations building. Wastewater clarifiers are also located on-Site to pre-treat wash water prior to discharge to the sanitary sewer.

The purpose of this service order is to provide environmental due diligence consulting services and to develop rough order of magnitude (ROM) costs that may be incurred during the redevelopment of the property located at 32-60 Stockton Avenue in San José, California. The City is evaluating the purchase of the property for potential future sale to Caltrans or the Santa Clara Valley Transportation Authority. The City has not determined the proposed development plans for the Site at this time. The ROM costs to be developed by Consultant will assume the City will need to enter into a separate Remedial Action Agreement with the Santa Clara County Department of Environmental Health (DEH) for the future redevelopment plans, with similar environmental remedial actions, mitigation measures, and monitoring and reporting programs as those required by DEH for similar sites. This will likely include additional soil pre-characterization, preparation of a Site Management Plan, dust monitoring, soil stockpile sampling, imported soil sampling, vapor mitigation measures, and a long-term groundwater, soil vapor, and/or indoor air monitoring program.

Task No. 1: Phase I Environmental Site Assessment

- A. <u>Services</u>: The Consultant will complete a Phase I Environmental Site Assessment following ASTM International (ASTM) Standard E1527-21 entitled "Standard Practice for Environmental Site Assessments: Phase I Environmental Site Assessment Process" (ASTM E1527-21)
- **B.** <u>Deliverable</u>: The Consultant will provide the following to the City's Contract Manager: The Phase I Environmental Site Assessment (ESA) Report.

Task No. 2: Development of Rough Order of Magnitude Costs

A. <u>Services</u>: The Consultant conducted a preliminary review of the prior investigation reports that were available for the Site including the draft Phase I ESAs and a Phase II ESA. The Phase I ESAs and Phase II ESA indicate that on-Site soil, groundwater, and soil vapor contain concentrations of several compounds above the screening levels (e.g., San Francisco Bay Regional Water Quality Control Board's

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Environmental Screening Levels), including total petroleum hydrocarbons in the diesel range, volatile organic compounds (VOCs), and metals including antimony, lead, and mercury.

The ROM costs to be developed by the Consultant will assume the City will need to enter into a separate Remedial Action Agreement with the Santa Clara County Department of Environmental Health for the future redevelopment plans, with similar environmental remedial actions, mitigation measures, and monitoring and reporting programs as those required by DEH for similar sites. This will likely include additional soil pre-characterization, preparation of a Site Management Plan, dust monitoring, soil stockpile sampling, imported soil sampling, vapor mitigation measures, and a long-term groundwater, soil vapor, and/or indoor air monitoring program.

The Consultant will complete the activities listed below to develop ROM costs anticipated to be incurred during construction activities:

- Perform the Phase I ESA, and conduct a thorough assessment of the Site's environmental conditions using the documents provided by the City and others that may be found in the Site's environmental regulatory records;
- Evaluate potential data gaps and include recommendations for additional environmental investigation activities or remedial actions, if warranted;
- Confirm appropriateness of previously recommended environmental activities identified in the Phase I ESAs; and
- Prepare a memorandum summarizing our assumptions and recommendations and ROM costs.
